



BUDGET MESSAGE

THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT CAP LAW

Chapter 89, Public Laws of 1990 as amended, places limits on municipal expenditures. Commonly referred to as the Local Government CAP Law, it limits increases in municipal appropriations to the lesser of 3% or an annually computed variable percentage index rate which reflects increases in the basic costs of governmental operations (the index rate) over that appropriated for the previous year.
